The Multicultural Center of Auburn University exists to enhance cultural experiences through outreach, service and scholarship. The center aims to promote diversity in order to create and sustain a well-rounded environment for students, faculty, staff, the administration and the community.

The vision of the center is based on the "the advancement of cross-cultural integration and inclusion, while supporting academic and cultural programs designed to broaden our understanding of culture while diminishing personal biases."



According to the Auburn University Multicultural page, the vision of the Multicultural Center is based on the following:

-Supporting activities focused on the recruitment and retention of students from unrepresented groups.

-To create an environment that ensures that



underrepresented students and international students feel at home and succeed at Auburn University.

-To serve as a support system for cultural and ethnic student organizations.

-To serve as a resource center for faculty, staff and the community.



The Multicultural Center, formerly the Center for Diversity and Race Relations (CDRR), was created in October 2002 and dedicated on January 14, 2003. The center was established based on the result of unfortunate incidents on the campus of Auburn University. Due to these events, the Multicultural Diversity Commission recommended the establishment of this unit in 2001. CDRR eventually progressed, and became large enough to unite with the Office of Diversity and Multicultural Affairs in the spring of 2006.

The Multicultural Center continues to uphold its goals and mission through its unification with the CDRR. Scheduled for opening in 2008, the center will maintain its own comprehensive resource library with accommodations for people from all walks of life.



**Peer Mentoring Program**

In order to unite people of different cultures and help people embrace the environment around them, the Multicultural center created the Peer Mentoring Program (PMP). The purpose of this program is to inspire underrepresented students to become leaders in the community. The purpose of this program is to allow students to reach their full potential, have equal mentoring opportunities and

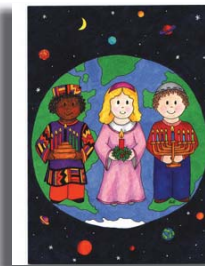
